Go Vote!

A proposal to The IFPTE Local 161

There will always be disagreements about the direction of the country – unanimity in terms of actual social, economic, cultural and foreign policies is impossible. But the system we use for ensuring an honest competition between those different views of the country must be sacrosanct. There must be a level playing field; a government of laws, not men – or we simply no longer have democracy. – Murray Dobbin

Dear Mr. Linsdell,

Canada's democracy is in crisis. We have a prime minister and a government that are dismantling, whether we like it or not, a Canada that three generations of Canadians have built. How can this be happening when this government was democratically elected to represent the values and vision of our country?

It could be argued that democracy today is not working because so many people are opting out. In the last election, about 9 million eligible voters didn't vote. And the Conservatives won a majority government by only 6,201 votes across 14 ridings!

This matters because the most basic principles of democracy have been undermined ever since. As you know, the list of Stephen Harper's assaults on democracy is long and unprecedented. Abuses of power such as Bill C-23 or the (un)fair election act, the new voter suppression Bill C-50, and the robocalls scandal are only a few.

The list goes on and while some of the violations are clearly more serious than others, taken as a whole they add up to a dangerous undermining of our democratic traditions, institutions and precedents – and politics.

While voting alone is not the solution to a failing democracy, it is one critical step within our means in the next few months to see some change we want.

The Council of Canadians is forging ahead with engaging Canadians in the upcoming election and we are asking for The IFPTE Local 161's partnership.

Our "Go Vote!" campaign is a five point voter engagement campaign aimed to produce a groundswell of new voters — led by young people — that will deliver victories for progressive candidates in battleground ridings. Please have a look at the enclosed document for more details. We also encourage you to mobilize your members to take part in our Town Halls and canvassing campaign.

CUPE National has already committed \$50,000 to this campaign. And PSAC National has pledged \$10,000 to the Ottawa efforts. A funding contribution from The IFPTE Local 161 would strengthen your own cause and build on our mutual strength. Together, we have the capacity to inspire a movement of young and first-time voters, led by Brigette DePape to "Go Vote!" This could be a legitimate game-changer in the election.





You know Brigette as the young parliamentary page who held up her iconic "Stop Harper!" sign in the Senate. She has since emerged as a leading voice on the political landscape and a driving force within many youth movements – including with the Council of Canadians!

In the coming months, our chapter activists will be busy across the country distributing tens of thousands of Voter's Guides. We will be holding a series Town Halls in targeted ridings, and meeting directly with people some of which are your members - in their communities. With our allies, we will build on each other's momentum to reach out and directly engage students and young people traditionally dismissed by our leaders and devise strategies to overcome systemic barriers that suppress their vote.

The Council of Canadians is a non-partisan organization. And while we don't tell people how to vote, our organization is a strong defender of democracy, and as such, believes it is imperative in this 2015 federal election that people be informed and reminded about the numerous ways in which Stephen Harper and his Conservative government have, and continue to, undermine our Canadian democracy.

For those of you less familiar with The Council of Canadians, please visit us at canadians.org. Our strong advocacy work precludes us from having charitable status under CRA guidelines, but this allows our work to be as direct and uncompromising as necessary without fear of government interference or reprisal. The Council does not accept any government or corporate funding either. We are sustained entirely by the generous support of individuals and organizations that share our progressive values.

Mr. Linsdell, I know the significance that goes along with a request like this and I'm deeply grateful for your consideration. We believe that through this purposeful collaboration, The IFPTE Local 161 and The Council of Canadians can more effectively advance our shared goals of building a better Canada.



Cross-Canada series of Town Halls In strategic ridings, high-profile speakers will deliver sharp criticism of the current government agenda, convert community outrage into action, draw national media coverage and amplify our common narrative;

Get-out-the-vote (GOTV) Campaign led by Brigette DePape. Creative events and teach-ins on campuses and with young workers' committees across Canada will directly engage students and young people, survey them on key issues of concern, and devise strategies to overcome systemic barriers that suppress the youth vote;

Door to Door canvassing With voters in battleground ridings, combined with Voter Pledge drives in high traffic areas. From community list-building, volunteers will be recruited and trained to sustain local GOTV campaigns;

Voters' Guides Factsheets and other election resources designed to educate and enable voters to cast an informed ballot. Specific youth-oriented election resources will be designed using feedback obtained from direct dialogue with young people;

Ad campaign Led by Brigette DePape, a positive "Go Vote!" call to action. Ads on social media, television and public transportation will reach more than one million voters in the months, weeks and days leading up to Election Day.




